Announcement of Board Candidates

The 26-member ACCT Board of Directors consists of 15 directors elected regionally, nine directors-at-large elected by the Senate, and two directors appointed by the ACCT Chair. A full elected term is three years. Directors serve staggered terms.

At the Annual ACCT Congress, one director is elected from each of the five regions during the Regional Caucuses and Meetings, and three directors are elected at-large during the Senate meeting.

Regional Nominating Committees met during the week of February 9, 2025 to interview and nominate candidates for regional directors and support directors-at-large. Candidates are listed above.

SOUTHERN REGION




Yvonne Barnes Trident Technical College, SC

Andra Hoffman Los Angeles Community College District, CA

Andra Hoffman was elected to the Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) Board of Trustees in March of 2015 and was elected President of the Board on July 10, 2019. The Los Angeles Community College District is the largest District in the Country, representing over 250,000 students, nine campuses and serving students from 40 cities.

As a Member of the Board of Trustees. Ms. Hoffman serves as Chair of the Los Angeles Community College District Budget & Finance Committee. This committee oversees the District's \$5.8 billion dollar budget and is responsible for fiscal oversight, accountability and prudent stewardship of public dollars allocated to the nine LACCD campuses, the District headquarters and the voter approved facilities construction bonds totaling over \$9 billion.

Ms. Hoffman was elected by her peers from across the State to serve on the prestigious California Community College Trustees Board of the League (CCCT), a policy making Board that represents and advocates for all of California's community colleges. She recently completed her term as the association's President and now serves as Immediate past-President.



Robert Proctor Lansing Community College, MI

Robert Proctor has been a Trustee at Lansing Community College (LCC) since July 2003; he is the longest serving trustee in the history of the college. Robert has been an LCC student as well as an adjunct faculty member. He is an attorney who practices in the areas of labor and employment law. Robert has served as Counsel to the Labor Committee and the Committee on Constitutional Revision and Women's Rights of the Michigan House of Representatives. He also served as an administrative law judge for more than twenty-three years for the Michigan Civil Service Commission.

As an LCC trustee Robert has served as Board Chair, Secretary/Treasurer, and Treasurer; he currently chairs the Audit Committee and the Policy Committee. Robert was twice elected to the Diversity Committee of the ACCT and served as Chair of the Committee in 2014. He has served as a member of the Trustee Advisory Committee since 2020. Robert has also been active in the Michigan Community College Association (MCCA) and just completed his term as Chair of the Board of Directors.

In 2022, Robert was the recipient of the Central Region Trustee Leadership Award. That award bespeaks the depth and breadth of Robert's commitment and service to the community college mission and that of the organizations championing that mission.



Ratification of Amendments to the ACCT Bylaws

AMENDMENT #1

Article I Purpose/Mission and Goals

Goals

In order to achieve our mission:

- We will enhance our knowledge and skills to master our role as board members.
- We will develop and affect public policy for the achievement of the mission and goals of our institutions.
- We will exemplify a standard of leadership behavior that is ethical and embraces the totality of ACCT's membership diversity.

In February 2025, the Impact and Success Committee replaced the former Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee at the request of the committee. The third bullet point goal in Article I of the Bylaws is not aligned with the new committee's title and focus. Additionally, ACCT seeks to reaffirm its commitment to ensuring our membership services are accessible and valuable to all members, across the range of institutional types and locations. ACCT greatly values the contributions and perspectives of all our member institutions and trustees, and is dedicated to fostering an environment where members feel supported and welcome within the association.

AMENDMENT #2

Article X Committees

Section 1, Appointment

The chair, with the approval of the Board of Directors, shall appoint such committees of the Association as seem advisable

Section 2, Governance and Bylaws Committee
There shall be a Governance and Bylaws Committee composed of
three or more members. The Governance and Bylaws Committee
shall perform the duties assigned in ARTICLES V and XIV, and
those assigned by the Board of Directors.

Section 3, Standing Committees

There shall be the following Standing Committees, each composed of three or more members: the Finance and Audit Committee, the Public Policy and Advocacy Committee, the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee **Impact and Success Committee**, and the Member Communications and Education Committee. All Standing Committees shall perform the duties assigned by the Board of Directors.

This change is related to Amendment #1. As previously indicated, in February 2025 the Impact and Success Committee replaced the former Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee at the request of the committee. A corresponding adjustment in the Bylaws is necessary to reflect this committee replacement.



About the ACCT Board of Directors

The ACCT Board of Directors represents community college trustees throughout the United States and several outlying territories. ACCT's membership territory is divided into five regions (Central, Northeast, Pacific, Southern, and Western).

The 26-member ACCT Board of Directors consists of 15 directors elected regionally, nine directors-at-large elected by the Senate, and two directors appointed by the Chair. A full elected term is three years. Directors serve staggered terms.

At the Annual ACCT Leadership Congress, one regional director is elected from each of the five regions (Central, Northeast, Pacific, Southern, and Western) at the Regional Caucuses and Meetings, and three directors are elected at-large at the Senate Meeting.

Regional Nominating Committees meet during the Community College National Legislative Summit (NLS) in February to interview and nominate candidates for regional directors and support directors-at-large. While meeting with Regional Nominating Committees is not required to be elected to the ACCT Board of Directors, it is *highly* encouraged, as candidates supported by their respective Regional Nominating Committees are designated as such during Regional Caucuses and the Senate meeting. Nominations will be accepted from the floor at the Annual ACCT Leadership Congress on all elections, however, provided that the nominee has a letter of support from his or her local board.

How to Join the ACCT Board of Directors*

Declaring your candidacy for a seat on the ACCT Board of Directors indicates that once elected, you will honor your commitment as a board member to attend and participate in all committee and board meetings. These meetings are held during the ACCT Annual Leadership Congress, the National Legislative Summit, and the Annual Summer Board Retreat; and when necessary, via teleconference between these three annual meetings if and when required to transact the business of the association. Your declared candidacy also serves as confirmation that your institution is willing to financially support your expenses related to travel and hotel accommodations during these meetings.

There are two ways to run for a seat (Regional Director or Director at-Large) on the ACCT Board of Directors:

REGIONAL CAUCUS RULES OF PROCEDURE

As specified by the ACCT Bylaws, each region shall, at a Regional Caucus held during the Annual ACCT Leadership Congress, prior to the Senate Meeting, elect a Regional Director and Regional Nominating Committee members.

Meeting Logistics:

Seating arrangement: The Regional Caucus Meeting room will be divided into two areas: The Voting Delegate Area and a General Seating Area.

- 1. The Voting Delegate Area is restricted to the voting delegates only.
- 2. In order to vote, voting delegates must wear their ACCT badges with "Voting Delegate" credentials.
- 3. In order for a delegate's vote to be counted on any matter, the delegate must be seated in the voting delegate area.
- 4. The ACCT Bylaws provide for nominations from the floor on all elections. Nominations must be made by a voting delegate from each candidate's respective institution. The voting delegate making the nomination must make the nomination on behalf of the member board and provide a letter affirming the member board's support at or before the nomination.
- 5. ACCT's regional teller is responsible for distributing ballots to voting delegates, collecting ballots, counting ballots, and reporting results to the Chair. The assistant regional teller and sergeant-atarms help the regional chair with these responsibilities.
- 6. Candidates for director-at-large positions may be introduced individually within an organized group and may speak for two minutes.

Positions to be elected:

a. Regional Director:

Regional director elections will take place in accordance with rules listed in the ACCT Bylaws. A majority of ballots cast is necessary for election as director. On any ballot, voting delegates may cast as many votes as there are positions to be filled. On any ballot, only one vote may be cast for a candidate. If one or more candidates is elected on any ballot, then the remaining candidates shall continue to be eligible for election to any position remaining to be filled. If no person is elected on any ballot, then the candidate receiving the lowest number of votes on that ballot shall be dropped before the next ballot. If there are no more candidates than positions to be filled, the election shall be by acclamation.

b. Regional Nominating Committee Members:

Each Regional Nominating Committee is responsible for the nomination of Directors of the Association and shall be composed of five members each. These members shall be elected from the voting members of that region at the caucuses held during the Annual Congress of the Association. No more than one member shall be from the same state. Vacancies shall be filled by the regional chair with consideration given to filling the vacancy with a trustee from the same state as the committee member who vacated the position. A member of the Board of Directors cannot serve as a member of the Nominating Committee. In order to be considered for nomination to the Board of Directors, a nominating committee member must tender his/her resignation to the regional chair, postmarked 30 days prior to the scheduled nominating committee meeting at the National Legislative Summit.

Nominating Committee members shall serve for two-year staggered terms. They may serve more than one term, but terms may not be consecutive. The chair of each nominating committee shall be elected by the respective nominating committee at the close of the regional caucus and meeting.

Note: Campaign materials are not to be posted or distributed at the voting delegate sign-in table. Active campaigning is not allowed at the voting delegate sign-in table.

SENATE RULES OF PROCEDURE

As defined by the Association Bylaws, the Senate has the full authority of the membership and is composed of the voting delegates of the Voting Members of the Association.

The Senate will elect three Directors-at-Large during the Annual Meeting of the Association.

The Senate shall hold at least one meeting annually which is the Annual Meeting of the Association. Special meetings of the Senate may be called by the chair or a majority of the Board of Directors. The following Rules of Procedure will be followed during all Senate Meetings.

Meeting Logistics:

Seating arrangement: The Senate Meeting room will be divided into two areas: The Voting Delegate Area and a General Seating Area.

- 1. The Voting Delegate Area is restricted to the voting delegates only.
- 2. During the official Senate proceedings, non-voting members and guests are restricted from the Voting Delegate Area.
- 3. In order to vote, voting delegates must wear his/her ACCT badge with "Voting Delegate" credentials.
- 4. ACCT's regional teller is responsible for distributing ballots to voting delegates, collecting ballots, counting ballots, and reporting results to the Chair. The assistant regional teller and sergeantat-arms help the regional chair with these responsibilities.

- 5. All voting delegates must wear their ACCT **Director-at-Large Candidacy:** badge with "Voting Delegate" designation.
- 6. In order for a delegate's vote to be counted on any matter, the delegates must be seated in the voting area.
- 7. Only voting delegates may speak on any motion and must go to the microphone in order to speak: No voting delegate may speak to any motion for more than two minutes. No voting delegate may speak to any motion a second time until all voting delegates who wish to address the motion have been recognized. Voting delegates may be recognized for further discussion at the will of the Chair.
- 8. During the official Senate proceedings, non-voting trustees are restricted from the voting delegate area.
- 9. The ACCT Bylaws provide for nominations from the floor on all elections. Nominations must be made by a voting delegate from each candidate's respective institution. The voting delegate making the nomination must make the nomination on behalf of the member board and provide a letter affirming the member board's support at or before the nomination.
- 10. The ACCT coordinator of tellers supervises the ballot counting reporting process in accordance with Bylaws rules and regulations.
- 11. Campaign materials are not to be posted or distributed within the Senate meeting room.
- 12. A majority of ballots cast is necessary for election as director-at-large. On any ballot, voting delegates may cast as many votes as there are positions to be filled. On any ballot, only one vote may be cast for a candidate. If one or more candidates are elected on any ballot, then all remaining candidates shall continue to be eligible for election to any position remaining to be filled. If no person is elected on any ballot, then the candidate receiving the lowest number of votes shall be dropped before the next ballot.
- 13. Director-at-large candidates shall receive only one opportunity to address the Senate in support of their candidacy. The order in which director-at-large candidates will address the Senate shall be determined by lot.

- 1. If a candidate is to be nominated from the floor at the Senate Meeting and has notified ACCT 10 days prior to the date of Regional Caucuses, the candidate will be eligible to address voting members at Regional Caucuses along with other nominated candidates. Candidates who notify ACCT fewer than 10 days prior to the date of Regional Caucuses WILL NOT be eligible to address voting members at Regional Caucuses.
- 2. Candidates shall meet with ACCT staff 15 minutes prior to the start of regional caucuses. The order of addressing the caucuses shall be determined by drawing a number. Candidates will be allowed to speak for two minutes at each caucus. After nominations from the floor have been completed, each candidate may address the delegates for two minutes. The order of speaking at the Senate will be the reverse of the order at the caucuses. Candidates will meet with ACCT staff at the side of the room in pre-determined order. The parliamentarian will serve as timekeeper for candidate speeches.

Voting Procedure:

- 1. The ACCT coordinator of tellers, appointed by the chair, supervises the ballot counting reporting process in accordance with Bylaws rules and regulations.
- 2. A majority of ballots cast is necessary for election as director-at-large:
 - a. On any ballot, voting delegates may cast as many votes as there are positions to be filled.
 - b. On any ballot, only one vote may be cast for a candidate.
 - c. If one or more candidates are elected on any ballot, then all remaining candidates shall continue to be eligible for election to any position remaining to
 - d. If no person is elected on any ballot, then the candidate receiving the lowest number of votes shall be dropped before the next ballot.
 - e. If there are no more candidates than positions to be filled, the election shall be by acclamation.



ACCT CAMPAIGN REGULATIONS

BOARD OF DIRECTORS CANDIDATES

- 1. Campaign materials are not to be posted or distributed at the Voting Delegate Sign-In Table. Active campaigning is not allowed at the Voting Delegate Sign-In Table.
- 2. Campaign materials are not to be posted on the walls or distributed within the Senate meeting room or within Regional Caucus rooms.
- 3. Election volunteers shall not affix or wear campaign materials during the Senate or Caucus meeting.

Caucus election volunteers are the following:

Regional Chair (or designee), Regional Teller, Regional Assistant Teller, Regional Sergeant at Arms, Regional Nominating Committee Chair (or designee), ACCT staff and parliamentarian.

Senate election volunteers are the following:

ACCT Chair (or designee), Coordinator of Tellers, Assistant Coordinators of Tellers, Regional Tellers, Regional Assistant Tellers, Regional Sergeant at Arms, ACCT staff and parliamentarian.

4. Candidate promotional material will be displayed on a table provided by ACCT. The amount of table space will be determined by ACCT and in relation to space constraints at each respective

Congress location. Additional tables and/or easels shall not be purchased or used to display campaign material outside of the ACCT provided table space. Campaign material, posters, buttons and paraphernalia shall not be displayed on or leaned against an easel designated for Caucus Room signage or Senate room signage.

- 5. The ACCT Coordinator of Tellers and the Assistant Coordinators of Tellers shall be responsible for making sure that candidates comply with campaign material rules.
- 6. Candidates must comply with the ACCT Coordinator of Tellers and/or the Assistant Coordinators Tellers request(s) for removal of campaign material from undesignated areas. If the candidate does not comply, the Coordinator of Tellers and/or the Assistant Coordinators of Tellers remove the material.
- 7. Declared candidates, upon request, will be provided with a list of trustee mailing address by region in electronic form or on paper for use for in their campaign only. Staff shall provide a mailing list as long as the request was made 30 days prior to the Congress.

ACCT Board Committees Seek Associates for 2026

Inviting member trustees to serve on ACCT Board Committees expands membership participation in the governance of the Association, while bringing new ideas and expertise to committee deliberations.

Committees for 2026 will be formed before the first of the year. Member trustees are asked to indicate their interest in serving as associate committee members for a one-year term by November 1, 2025. Those interested in serving should submit the 2026 Associate Committee Interest Form indicating committee preferences (if only one choice is listed and you are not selected to serve on the committee of your choice, you may not be placed on another committee unless second and third choices are indicated). If you wish to include comments relating to your committee choices and areas of expertise, please include them in the "Comments" section of the form. Each request must have a letter of nomination from the individual's board supporting the appointment to an ACCT Committee.

ACCT Board Committees seeking volunteer members are:

- Impact and Success The Impact and Success Committee provides the expertise to ensure that the membership has access to best practices leading to effective policymaking for student success.
- Finance and Audit The Finance and Audit Committee is responsible for monitoring executive compliance with fiscally related Policies and Bylaws, reviewing the annual budget, the financial audit, establishing procedures for the periodic audit of Association programs and services, and reporting to the Board of Directors.

- Governance and Bylaws The Governance and Bylaws Committee is responsible for reviewing resolutions related to the governance of the Association, amendments to the ACCT Bylaws, and Board Policies. In fulfilling this charge, the Committee helps ensure that the Board of Directors is fulfilling its role to represent member boards in determining and demanding appropriate organizational performance through its written governing policies.
- Member Communications and Education - The Member Communications and Education Committee is responsible for evaluating and making recommendations to strengthen the Board's links with the membership; identifying issues that require member input; and recommending strategies to gather input. Additionally, committee members evaluate and make recommendations to strengthen current ACCT education programs and recommend additional programs that promote effective board governance through advocacy and education.
- Public Policy and Advocacy –
 The Public Policy and Advocacy
 Committee is charged with
 reviewing public policy issues and
 recommending positions to the
 Board of Directors.

ACCT Board Policy states that the ACCT Chair will appoint committees. In making appointments, the chair will consider regional representation and other factors. Each committee chair shall be a member of the Board of Directors.

Associate members may be appointed to a committee under the following conditions:

- 1. They shall be selected from voting members.
- 2. They may serve three consecutive one-year terms per committee.
- No more than one associate member from a college shall serve on any one board committee.
- 4. All related expenses are the responsibility of their college.
- 5. They have full voting rights.
- 6. They shall have a letter of nomination from their board supporting the appointment to an ACCT committee.

Please Note: Associate Committee Members currently serving in 2025 MUST re-apply if they are interested in serving in 2026. Colleges may submit a letter of support covering two years of service, but the Committee Interest Form must be filled out each year.

ACCT committees will meet in 2026 just prior to the Community College National Legislative Summit, scheduled February 8-11, 2026 at the Marriott Marquis in Washington, D.C., and a day or two before the Annual ACCT Leadership Congress in Chicago, Illinois on October 21-24, 2026. Committee work may also be done through e-mail and postal mail.

The commitment of Nominating Committee members in carrying out their duties helps to ensure that the Association's future leadership is comprised of member trustees who have demonstrated quality leadership in community colleges. Nominating Committee members nominate candidates who are committed to and support the fulfillment of ACCT's mission - Through the Association of Community College Trustees, community college governing boards are THE LEADING ADVOCATES of the nation's community college system.

Benefits of Serving on a Regional Nominating Committee

- Identify effective future leaders;
- Serve as a stepping-stone for you to aspire to a future leadership position;
- Strengthen leadership in your region; and
- Ensure more benefits to your college and state through strong, effective leadership of the association.

Responsibilities

Regional Nominating Committees are the key to a successful election process for the ACCT Board of Directors. Each year, the committees are responsible for reviewing candidate applications, interviewing candidates, and nominating trustees for Regional Director. Nominating Committees may also support Director-at-Large candidates.

Election/Composition/Terms
