| What has the CEO initiated or helped to develop in the area of diversity, equity and inclusion to improve student success? s Diversity Equity Center (DEC) was established to promote awareness, understanding, and fair treatment for all people, ideas, and cultures by providing a dedicated space on campus. Despite its established presence on campus, 's support and leadership led to the DEC being relocated to a more prominent location during his tenure. Relocating the DEC presented challenges as it required moving decades of memorabilia and history, which caused resistance from the larger community. Despite this, recognized the importance of centering the hub of student life around diversity and equity, and with his excellent mediation skills and support, the DEC was successfully relocated. |

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| Although he will be retiring at the end of this year, is doing everything he can to establish and maintain positive working relationships with regional tribes. He has also championed ongoing Diversity Equity Inclusion and Belonging trainings for staff and faculty. |
| How has the CEO served on technical or special committees serving two-year postsecondary education, and what impact did this effort have in the community, state, or nation? |
| During his two-year tenure as committee chair for Community College Presidents, was tasked with the challenging goal of creating a fair funding formula that would distribute funds equally among all colleges, regardless of enrollment, geography, and programming. With his exceptional mediation skills, sense of fairness, and loyalty to smaller colleges, successfully negotiated a funding formula that was widely accepted and adopted by all. His ability to bring all sides to a consensus was highly praised by presidents throughout the state. |
| As the only post-secondary institution in our rural, two-county district, simpact within the community is significant, and his input is highly valued by all stakeholders. In 2011, when our county's chamber of commerce merged with our economic development council, played a crucial role in integrating staff, boards, and community supporters into a merged organization. This was yet another instance where is leadership, mentorship, and ability to get people on board with new ideas and ways of doing things were essential to the success of the project. | 's involvement with has also enabled him to develop strong relationships with state legislators, and he regularly speaks with them and testifies before critical legislative hearings on matters that greatly impact two-year post-secondary funding. 's leadership style is often described as passionate and caring, and it brings out the best in his staff, students, and colleagues. It is dedication to excellence is evident in everything he does, and he inspires others to strive for the same level of commitment and innovation. How has the CEO been active in developing, organizing, or supporting state and/or national two-year postsecondary education associations? 's dedication to community college education extends beyond his own institution. He has been deeply involved with the state community college presidents' association, even serving as its president. In 2013chaired a committee responsible for reviewing and making recommendations on how to allocate funds to the 34 colleges in the state. This task had not been done in a decade, and 's leadership in creating a more equitable funding method earned him widespread praise from his colleagues. As a strong communicator with an ability to communicate clearly and directly with his peers and lawmakers on complex issues, has earned considerable respect as an advocate for the entire system, despite leading the smallest college in the state. He has advocated passionately and effectively on critical issues facing community colleges, including corrections education, adult basic education, and Guided Pathways for students. has also been active in leadership roles within the State Association for Community College Administrators, having served as both president and past-president. He continues to play a key role in the Educational Leadership Academy, where he mentors employees to become strong and effective leaders. What has the CEO published in the area of two-year postsecondary educational concepts? 's expertise in correctional facility education, as evidenced by his doctoral dissertation examining the correlation between educational programs and recidivism, is highly relevant to his role at college's adult education program at Correctional Center, one of the state's largest, benefits greatly from solves and experience in correctional site work. His knowledge of the prison's operations has been instrumental in budget discussions at the state level and has had a significant impact on the college and the community at large. His writing skills, like his verbal abilities, are exceptional. sensitive and skilled in knowing the impression that the written and spoken word can make, yet he is direct and decisive in specifying directions for our college.

His writing is direct, decisive, and thoughtful, and he frequently communicates throughout campus and our community through memos, opinion pieces, and radio appearances. During the college's transition to ctcLink, he provided regular messages of support and guidance, which helped maintain positive morale amongst employees. | What outstanding characteristics of the CEO motivated your nomination? is an exceptional leader who truly embodies the qualities and values of the award he has been nominated for. assumed the presidency of the College in 2004. For the next 12 years, has demonstrated a deep commitment to serving the needs of our students, staff, and the broader community. It lived this vision daily, presenting a consistently professional yet caring attitude toward all, until he retired at the end of the 2015-2016 school year. Four years later, successor, retired from his role as president due to health concerns. The college board of trustees offered an one-year contract as interim president. accepted the offer and reported to work the following Monday. |
| In the midst of the pandemic and unable to vet candidates in person, the board moved to extend 's contract through June, 2023. 's decision to come out of retirement and then to extend his tenure during the unprecedented challenge of a global pandemic is just one example of his leadership style and willingness to put the needs of our college and community before his own. |
| Now in his last year as president, has been actively involved in the search for his successor and has played a pivotal role throughout the search and interviews, and he is now proving instrumental in the onboarding process. He has invited the incoming president to meetings, introduced her to key community stakeholders, and provided valuable insights into the job. Additionally, has done everything he can to leave in the best place possible for the new president to take the lead.
