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




# Community College Legislative Priorities

#### **Budget Reconciliation Issues**

- Committees of Jurisdiction: Budget, Finance, Ways & Means, HELP, Ed/Workforce
- Reconciliation can pass with just 51 Senate votes, avoiding filibuster, but can only contain items that involve direct spending or taxation; must be enabled by budget resolution
- Republicans control process but are not unified on whether to pursue one or two bills; President Trump has stated support for one (House leadership preference)
- If two bill strategy is adopted (tentative Senate plan), first bill will likely focus on immigration, border security, and national security; second bill on tax
- Reconciliation Priorities:
  - Oppose: Risk-sharing!; reductions in support to low-income students; taxing grants and scholarships
  - Support: Tax-free Pell Grant Act, Bipartisan Workforce Pell Act



#### **Workforce Legislation**

- Committees of Jurisdiction: HELP, Education and Workforce
- Key Workforce-related legislation
  - Bipartisan Workforce Pell Act (House short-term Pell bill)
  - JOBS Act (Senate short-term Pell bill)
  - Strengthening America's Workforce Act (WIOA Reauthorization)
    - Agreed to by "four corners" (committee leaders of both parties in both chambers) last Congress
    - Authorized Strengthening Community College Workforce Education Grants



## **Tax Policy**

- Committees of Jurisdiction: Finance, Ways and Means
- Enact "Tax-Free Pell Grant Act"
  - Ends taxation on Pell dollars used to support cost of living while enrolled
  - Enables community college student Pell Grant recipients to receive \$2,500 American Opportunity Tax Credit
- Prime opportunity this Congress:
  - 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act expires in 2025, and reconciliation legislation will certainly include sweeping tax provisions
  - Tax-Free Pell Grant Act overwhelmingly impacts only community college students; political plus
  - Bill has extremely low scorekeeping "cost" -- \$1.9 billion over ten years



## **Appropriations**

- Committees of Jurisdiction: House and Senate Appropriations
- Bolster Pell Grants: Increase maximum grant by least \$200; adequately fund program
- Support key student-focused programs:
  - SEOG
  - CCAMPIS
  - Postsecondary Student Success Grants
  - Basic Needs for Postsecondary Students programs
  - Federal Work Study
  - Trio and GEAR UP

### Appropriations, Cont'd

- Committees of Jurisdiction: House and Senate Appropriations
- Strengthening Under-resourced Institutions
  - Minority Serving Institutions, including HSIs, AANAPISIs and PBIs
  - Title III-A Strengthening Institutions
  - Strengthening HBCUs and Tribal Colleges
- Strengthening Community College Training Grants (Dept of Labor)



#### Farm Bill

- Committees of Jurisdiction: House and Senate Agriculture
- Invest in community colleges' increasing role in advanced agriculture and the training of workers in this sector
- Combat food insecurity on campus by streamlining access to SNAP benefits for eligible students
- Strengthen SNAP E&T program by disregarding income earned by recipients on earn-and-learn pathways



#### Accountability

- Committees of Jurisdiction: HELP and Education and Workforce
- Support the reintroduction and passage of the College Transparency Act
  - Creates federal student level data network that unlocks earnings and other data
  - HELP chair Cassidy has been Republican lead in Senate
  - Cannot be included in reconciliation because it does not involve direct spending
- Ensure that any borrowing-related outcome measures (including those proposed in risk-sharing) reflect the proportion and amounts that an institution's students borrow



#### **Immigration/Dream Act**


- Committees of Jurisdiction: House and Senate Judiciary
- Support legislation that provides a pathway to citizenship for immigrants brought to the U.S. as children
- Allow successful participation in higher education to serve as a pathway for those wishing to advance their immigration status



#### **Community College Caucus**

- Republican and Democratic leaders in the House of Representatives have relaunched the Community College Caucus
- Co-Chairs are Reps. Bilirakis (R-FL) and Courtney (D-CT)
- Goal is to elevate community colleges' needs and provide a forum for bipartisan discussion of issues
- All House of Representatives members can participate





# Tips and Reminders for NLS Prep

#### **Gathering Your College Data and Stories**

- Provide "Fast Facts" and/or relevant facts about your college and student body e.g., low cost, business relationships and economic impact, student success efforts, etc.
- Prepare federal funds worksheet
- Identify best campus stories to share









### **Planning Your Meeting: Content**

- What are your high priority asks?
- What arguments and anecdotes will you use to support the asks and what data will you share?
- It always helps to emphasize students!
- What are your member's policy interests and which committees do they serve on?



### **Planning Your Meeting: Logistics**

- Who will take on various roles and cover specific topics?
- Who will take notes?
- What are your leave-behinds and who will bring them?
- Who will do follow up?



#### **Planning Your Meeting: Tips**

- Leave enough time between meetings to get from one place to another.
  - The Congressional campus is large! With security, it can take 15 to 20 minutes or even more to go from House to Senate and vice versa
- Arrive early if possible! Member schedules are fluid. Legislators may not be able to wait for you.
  - If a prior meeting runs late, update the next office as soon as possible
- Be flexible -- Hill offices are small, especially on the House side.
  - If you're meeting with staff only, you may meet at their desk or in a hallway  $\odot$ .
- Time may be limited, cover your top priorities first.
